Science Fair Terms/Conditions

1. All members of the Queen's community are encouraged to submit projects for the Science Fair. Faculty, staff, students & alumni may all participate.
2. Project acceptance guarantees the participants to three complimentary passes to Science Fair and a hospitality bag of swag donated by our sponsors. All attending participants must be 19+. The top 12 chosen by us will be able to participate in the event on the 13th.
3. All projects are required to demonstrate the successful (or hilariously unsuccessful) achievement of their attempted task before a panel of judges. Those projects that involve prohibited activities or materials in Clark Hall Pub (e.g. projectiles, with home made alcohol, dangerous substances, etc.) are encouraged to seek alternative demonstrations, such as recording a video of their attempts.
4. Golden Words retains the right to photographs of projects to use as promotion all material.
5. Golden Words has the right to deny any project from participating in Science Fair, on the condition that reason is given to the Project Contributors.
6. If you break Clark, you pay for Clark. But please don't break Clark because we just got it back.
